As you know we had an Ofsted inspection in the last week of term 3. We received the official report yesterday and we are pleased to inform you that the opening line reads Oakhill

School 'continues to be a good school'.

We are particularly proud as it recognises that we have maintained our standards within the context of a new curriculum, national assessment processes and Ofsted framework. Ofsted confirms



that leadership is both reflective and accurate in its selfevaluation and the school development plan focuses on the right priorities. The development points will allow us the opportunity to build on the work that has already taken place and enable our school to provide the best educational experience for our whole school community. We have attached a copy of the report for you to read.





















Children really enjoyed coming in as characters from their class books. They particularly liked sharing their learning with other classes.











We hope parents enjoyed coming into school for Showcase and shared in their children's enthusiasm for their learning. We have received many positive comments about children's work in books, the classroom environments and the opportunity to talk about school activities with their children.

Lots of parents were able to see the topic work around Just One Book as well as maths activities and Safer Internet Day.









In our awareness activities on Safer Internet Day, classes worked together to reflect on the personal information we share, both face-to-face and electronically. They discussed who and in what situations we can share this information and discussed some dilemmas we may face online. Younger children explored the Create, Connect and Share Respect initiative.







The children have launched into their new enquiry for this term, The Mystery of the Galaxy. The mobile planetarium will visit next week and we are very grateful to the PTA who made payment for this to happen. We hope children are inspired and tell you all about it. We will be having a space themed dress up day on 19th March, so you can begin to think about and create an outfit – alien, astronaut, rocket etc. We will ask for a donation of £1 to contribute to school funds for activities and trips. Our showcase for this topic will be on Thursday  $22^{nd}$  March when you'll be able to see the outcomes of this topic.







### Parent Voice

Thank you to those parents who attended Parent Voice and those who emailed points to be raised. These were discussed by those present and further conversation will continue between leadership, staff and parents over the coming weeks. The main points were:

- Play equipment in Swallows area Work needs to be completed on the tarmac surround and the height of the ship. We are working with health and safety and the contractor to hopefully have the equipment ready for the children to use at the start of the summer term.
- Trips A positive discussion around the importance and value of school trips took place. The school recognises the financial impact of residentials on families. However, parents were confident that this should not prevent the school organising and asking for contributions for other activities, both on and off site. The consensus was that fundraising activities and donations from those wishing to contribute more to school funds should be positively promoted. As a start, we are holding a dress up day in March and monies raised will support this. Parents also suggested that an Oakhill Wish List could be publicised in order that they could contribute as they desire.
- Homework Questions were asked about the quantity and value given to homework
  across the school. Homework is a key area on our school development plan. To date,
  leadership has prioritised other areas and homework is scheduled to be the focus for this
  term.
- Steps to Swallows We all recognise the potential dangers of steps, particularly in the icy weather. It was agreed that children are parents' responsibility at the start of the school day and need to supervise children walking to the classroom. Should conditions be especially treacherous, we will assess the risk and if appropriate parents can bring children through the main school.
- Somerset Live There was some confusion regarding the validity of the information published on this website. This has been addressed by informing parents via email.


Our After School Club is still looking for a supervisor for 5 hours every week. Please enquire at the office if you are interested.
